



## **End-of-Life Doula Certification Requirements for Folks who Trained with Another Organization**

1. Purchase and download the Lifespan Doulas “Certification Packet Trained by Others,” containing instructions and forms, from the website (\$100).
2. Complete the application to become a certified EOLD with Lifespan Doulas.
3. Show proof of having completed another organization’s end-of-life doula training.
4. Complete required reading.
5. Sign the *Agreement to Abide by the Lifespan Doulas Scope of Practice for End-of-Life Doulas*.
6. Pass the comprehensive EOLD online certification exam (Certificate issued) OR submit proof of having earned the [NEDA Proficiency Badge](#) from the National End-of-Life Doula Alliance (NEDA’s cost is \$165). NEDA represents a diverse group of doulas and training organizations who have come together and agreed to create professional standards for the industry. Choosing this option will result in a dual credential—the NEDA Proficiency Badge (and associated directory listing on the NEDA website) and Lifespan Doulas End-of-Life Doula Certification.
