1. Complete your choice of:

3. Pass the comprehensive Birth Doula online certification exam with a score of 85% or higher. You can save your progress as you go and complete the test in multiple sessions if desired. You can take the exam as many times as necessary to achieve the passing grade.

Provided all requirements have been met, we will mail your certificate within two weeks. Your certification has no expiration date. It is a lifetime certification.
